The American Society for Engineering Education (ASEE) invites undergraduate, graduate and postdoctoral students to submit a 90-second video answering the question: How have you adapted to the virtual world during the COVID-19 pandemic?

Judging Period: March 16 - May 31, 2021

Winners Announced: Early June 2021

Contest Eligibility

Use your creativity as you answer the question: How have you adapted to the virtual world during the COVID-19 pandemic? This contest is open to individuals who reside in the fifty United States, including the District of Columbia, and territories and possessions of the United States, ages 18 and older. Full-time students residing in Canada will also be considered. All contestants must be full-time students currently enrolled in an undergraduate, graduate or post-doctoral program at an accredited college or university. Contest is void where prohibited. Contestants may work in teams of up to four individuals. To be considered for this contest, all participants are required to complete and sign any necessary release and waiver forms. One person shall be named the Spokesperson and is responsible for all submissions.

Full Rules and Information

ASEE invites undergraduate, graduate and post-doctoral students, attending an accredited college or university, to create a video answering the question: How have you adapted to the virtual world during the COVID-19 pandemic? To enter, access the official contest website: www.contest.asee.org during the contest period, complete the required registration application and submit to the SlideRoom database alongside all required release and waiver forms, as directed. Videos may only include authorized content, music, images or film clips. Entries must be successfully submitted no later than 11:59PM EST on March 15, 2021.

Limit of one (1) entry per person or team. Entries become property of ASEE and will neither be acknowledged nor returned.

A qualified committee of judges will select a first, second and third place winner, which will then be posted on the ASEE website and social media pages. There will be a limit of one (1) vote per person. If there is an event of a tie in voting, the tied videos will be judged by our selected committee. Winners will be individually notified by the provided email address in early June 2021.

3rd Annual ASEE Engineering CAS Student Video Contest: Rules

Prizes & Requirements

The first-place winner will receive a \$3,000 cash prize, the second-place winner will receive a \$1,500 cash prize and the third-place winner will receive a \$500 cash prize. No substitution may be given in place of the prize. Winners will be responsible for paying taxes on prizes, including cash prizes, and any expenses not specified relating to the acceptance and use of a prize. An IRS Form 1099 will be issued to winners where applicable. ASEE may reserve the right to contact the winner's school directly. Each winner will be required to provide a copy of a valid photo ID (driver's license, passport or other form of identification which includes proof of age); and evidence of enrollment as a student. Failure to return the required documents in a timely manner, or the return of any notification as undeliverable for any reason, will cause the entry to be void and an alternate winner to be selected. By participating, entrants must agree to these official rules and to the decisions of the judges and ASEE and its agents in all matters, including the voting process relating to the contest which decisions shall be final in all respects; release, indemnify and hold harmless ASEE, their respective directors, officers and employees, from any and all claims, liabilities, losses or damages of any kind whatsoever, including but not limited to the infringement of intellectual property rights of others, resulting in whole or in part from their participation in the contest and the acceptance and use of the prize; consent to the use of their name, likeness and location for advertising and publicity purposes by ASEE, in its sole discretion, of its products and services and for promotion of the importance of protection of intellectual property rights; and represent that the video submitted is their sole and original work and does not infringe the intellectual property rights of any other party.
